"Rock-breaking" means the removal of boulders or bedrock from land by drilling, percussive breaking (not hammering), or splitting, but excluding blasting					
"Control blasting plan" is the blasting plan developed for a site that specifies in what manner blasting operations are to be undertaken.					
"Blaster" is a person who is the holder of a valid, applicable Blaster's Certificate issued by a municipal, provincial, state, federal or recognized regulatory agency.					
"Independent blasting consultant" is a blasting professional with a minimum of five cumulative years of experience working in a consulting role in the blasting field in a Close Proximity blasting environment, a professional engineer with specific knowledge and expertise in blast design to meet specific objectives as well as the control of vibration and air over pressure, and who's experience is acceptable to the Director					
"Pre-blast survey" is a detailed record in written form, accompanied by photos/video, of the condition of private or public property, prior to the commencement of blasting operations.					
"Qualified monitor" A vibration consultant or person working under the supervision of a blasting consultant trained and/or certified on the use of vibration and air overpressure monitoring equipment.

an arborist report			
Require a Blasting Plan, developed and managed by the <i>Blaster</i> , monitored by a <i>Qualified monitor</i> , and reviewed by an owner-retained <i>Independent blasting consultant</i> , to be submitted and approved by the Director.			
The Blasting Plan must include a <i>pre-blast survey</i>			
Changes to the submitted Blasting Plan are subject to review and approval by the Director, including a change fee
