The Mayor called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. and acknowledged that the land on which we gather is in the traditional territory of the Coast and Straits Salish Peoples. Specifically we recognize the Lekwungen-speaking peoples, known today as the Songhees and Esquimalt Nations, and that their historic connections to these lands continue to this day.

MAYOR AND COUNCIL VERBAL REPORTS

Mayor Murdoch provided a brief update on the Capital Regional District, noting that the CRD is starting their budget process. Mayor Murdoch also noted that the CRD has finalised the structure to allow First Nations to sit as part of Committees, welcoming up to 9 First Nations members to sit on Committees.

NON-LAND USE BYLAWS

Heritage Commission Establishing Bylaw

The Deputy Director of Corporate Services provided an overview of the process to date and recent updates made to the Heritage Commission Establishing Bylaw. The Deputy Director highlighted that the recent workshop held on December 17, 2020 contributed to the updated Establishing Bylaw before Committee. Staff responded to questions from Committee related to timelines of Committee and Commission Meeting agenda and minutes publication, public notification methods and timelines, and the process for referring properties with heritage value to the Heritage Commission.

Mayor Murdoch called for public input, no calls from the public were received.

THAT it be recommended to Council that the updated draft Heritage Commission Establishing Bylaw be referred to Council as presented for consideration of first three readings.

DRAFT POLICITES AND REGULATIONS

Traffic Control Orders

The Manager of Engineering Services responded to questions from Committee and provided clarification on the justification for the 2 Hour Parking Traffic Control Order relating to 2001-2013 Oak Bay Avenue. The Manager provided an overview of the notification process for new traffic controls.

Mayor Murdoch called for public comment, no calls from the public were received.

THAT it be recommended to Council that the following Traffic Control Orders (TCO), outlined in the memorandum from the Manager of Engineering Services dated January 18, 2021, be approved:

TCO-2020-06 - Stop Sign - Orchard Avenue;

TCO-2020-07 - Stop Sign - Beaverbrooke Street;

TCO-2020-09 - Stop Sign - Hewlett Place;

TCO-2020-10 - Stop Sign - Mitchell Street;

TCO-2020-20 – Stop Sign - Theatre Lane;

TCO – 2 Hour Parking – 2001 to 2013 Oak Bay Avenue;

Amendments to Streets and Traffic Bylaw

THAT staff prepare an amendment to the Streets and Traffic Bylaw to provide additional powers that can be exercised by officers of the municipality without requiring Council to make an order;

AND THAT the Streets and Traffic Bylaw be amended to add the Municipal Hall parking lot as a Special Speed Zone – 20 km/hour.

AND FURTHER, THAT the communication convey the District's interest in developing a shared approach to design of Active Transportation improvements to Oak Bay Avenue in keeping with the District's planned Village Planning process.
