MINUTES of a regular meeting of the MUNICIPAL COUNCIL of The Corporation of the District of Oak Bay, held in the Council Chambers, Oak Bay Municipal Hall, 2167 Oak Bay Avenue, Oak Bay, B.C., on Monday February 23, 2015 at 7:30 p.m.

Mayor Jensen called the meeting to order at 7:30 p.m.

PRESENTATION – ART IN THE CHAMBERS PROJECT

Bronwyn Taylor, Chair, Oak Bay Heritage Commission, was in attendance to present two original pen and ink drawings illustrating heritage homes, to be added to the artwork collection displayed in the Council Chambers as part of the Art in Chambers project. Ms. Taylor introduced and thanked the two local artists: Marion Cumming, for Carr Cottage at 825 Foul Bay Road and Robert Amos, for Oak Bay War Memorial (Cenotaph) at Uplands Park, 2900 Block Beach Drive.

Mayor Jensen, on behalf of Council, thanked the artists for their contribution to the Art in Chambers project.

MAYOR'S REMARKS:

Bike BC Funding

Mayor Jensen offered his thanks to municipal staff for all their efforts in applying for and securing funding, for the Foul Bay and Lansdowne intersection bike lanes and bike loop detectors, in the amount of \$52,828.00.

Regional Governance

Mayor Jensen reported that the Mayor of Victoria has written a letter to Minister Coralee Oakes requesting the Provincial government undertake a study on regional governance.

Core Area Liquid Waste Management

Mayor Jensen reviewed the presentation on the Core Area Liquid Waste Management that the Capital Regional District gave at Committee Orientation.

PUBLIC PARTICIPATION PERIOD:

<u>Anthony Mears, Oak Bay resident</u>, asked if Victoria and Saanich will pay proportionately for the sewage project as they will be the largest users. Mayor Jensen responded that they will be paying the highest amounts as the costs are based on flows.

<u>William Jesse, resident</u>, remarked that he heard Mayor Jensen on the radio say that the SPCA were given the option to attend the deer cull and that they were pleased that Oak Bay hired an experienced contractor. Mr. Jesse said he spoke to the SPCA this afternoon and they told him these statements were not true.

<u>Kristy Kilpatrick, Oak Bay resident</u>, said she believed that knowing the BC SPCA did not support the cull and with the information provided to Council, that Council would listen. Of the 38 deer deaths only 13 were car/deer related and they were in an area where speed limits had not been reduced, she said. Ms. Kilpatrick continued by saying that 19 of the dead deer had no known reason for the death which probably was natural causes, and that there has been only one bike death cause by deer and that was over 20 years ago. She said that she believed that after talking to members of Council, that Council would listen and she is so disappointed.

<u>Danalee Goldthwaite, Oak Bay resident</u>, said that in a report to Council from the CAO dated October 14, 2014 regarding the deer cull it states that communications support will be required to prepare the community. Ms. Goldthwaite asked if the community can be prepared by knowing if the cull is on or when it will be on. Mayor Jensen responded by saying that Oak Bay has applied for a permit and it is valid until March 15, 2015.

Ms. Goldthwaite then asked if the community would be informed when the cull was on. Mayor Jensen responded by saying that the information would not be provided as there are concerns of what may happen, similar to what happened in Kimberly where people sought out the traps and destroyed them. Mayor Jensen continued by saying that Council wants to protect the privacy of the homes and the people who have asked to have traps placed on their property and that information will not be made public.

Ms. Goldthwaite said that she has looked at the provincial permit and it says that 21 days after the cull information needs to be made public. She said we will not know how many fawns were orphaned, how many pregnant or lactating does were, we won't know if the meat was actually eaten by anybody and if the kill was humane. We also need to know if the cull was effective, and there is no way to determine this as no proper count took place in Oak Bay so any number taken after the cull will be meaningless, she said. Ms. Goldthwaite concluded by saying none of the information regarding the cull is being documented by an independent body, that it is being done by the contractors doing the killings, which is very biased and a conflict of interest.

Mayor Jensen said there will be a report coming to Council regarding the pilot project undertaken with the CRD and it will be shared. He continued by saying that this is a learning process and part of the pilot project is to report out and develop best practices and information that can be used in other communities.
