The Municipal Administrator advised that following the recommendation from the Committee of the Whole, he became aware of circumstances that could give rise to a perception of bias if City Spaces Consulting was engaged as recommended, noting that he could obtain more proposals and pricing from other firms that could provide assistance with public events to share information and obtain input from the public on the issue of secondary suites.

Mr. Brennan further advised that once materials for any proposed public meetings or events were prepared, he intended to provide Council with the information and what the proposed event(s) would entail for its information and consideration.

Mr. Brennan advised Council, however, that the proposed request for proposals process would add at least an additional month onto the projected timelines previously discussed in relation to public events on the issue of secondary suites.

Responding to questions as to why a variance was being requested when the garage could be moved over so as not to require a variance, Mr. McCarthy indicated that they wanted the garage door to be behind the house and to be able to pull straight into the parking bay.

There was discussion regarding the application, and it was the majority view of members of Council that the variance was not supportable in that other locations for the garage that did not require a variance were possible.
