Re Minutes of the Meeting

(Lorna Curtis, Director of Parks and Recreation, and Frank Carson, Vice Chairman, Oak Bay Parks and Recreation Commission, in attendance for this item.)

Oak Bay Allotment Gardens

Frank Carson provided a brief overview of the allotment gardens review process that included looking at other region's policies, increasing the number of plots, tenure considerations, waitlists, and holding a public meeting (with Commission members, staff, current plot holders and waitlisted residents in attendance). Mr. Carson drew attention to the staff recommendations outlined in correspondence item no. 2010-53, adding that support was expressed by the current plot holders, and those on the waitlist, for continuing with the status quo.

Mr. Carson and Ms. Curtis responded to various questions from members of the Committee regarding the allotment gardens and noted that in relation to any potential new allotment garden locations, thought would have to be given to issues such as access to water, and possible concerns of neighbouring residents, therefore further investigation would be required in that regard. Mr. Carson said that the Parks and Recreation Commission would welcome any suggestions for suitable locations for additional community allotment gardens.

## Cosmetic Use of Pesticides Information

Attention was drawn to information recently circulated to Council members regarding a consultation paper on cosmetic use of pesticides, and it was suggested that a copy of the document be forwarded to the Parks and Recreation Commission for information.

It was noted by Mr. Carson that the Committee looking into the implications of implementing a pesticide use reduction bylaw would be bringing forward recommendations in this regard likely by April 2010.

3. 2010-54 DIRECTOR OF ENGINEERING SERVICES, February 8, 2010 ERIC NIELSEN, November 22, 2009
Re Boulevard Encroachment Process

The Director of Engineering Services provided an overview of his memorandum explaining that the proposed changes to streamline the boulevard encroachment process, which would require those wishing to plant on a boulevard to follow detailed guidelines as set out by bylaw, including using only the approved planting list, would significantly reduce the staff time currently required for applications of this nature. Mr. Marshall noted that structures on boulevards would still need to be approved by Council.

With respect to a question regarding the approved planting list, it was noted that the list includes low growing plants that are not prone to spreading. Responding to a question raised with respect to possible changes to the planting list, the Municipal Administrator advised that as time goes on other suitable species, approved by the Parks Department, could be added to the list as required through a bylaw amendment.

With regards to who would be responsible for reinstating any boulevard plantings that are disturbed due to infrastructure work being undertaken, it was noted that it would fall to the owner of the property adjacent to the boulevard in question.

A member of the Committee asked what the consequence would be for non compliance with the proposed boulevard encroachment regulations, and the Municipal Administrator advised that the Streets and Traffic Bylaw would be amended to specify what is allowed for boulevard encroachments, and layout that should the adjacent homeowner not comply, remediation of the boulevard could be done by the Municipality with the cost being billed to the owner, and if not paid, added to the property taxes.

Varying views and opinions were noted with respect to a suggestion from a member of the Committee that the approved planting list include vegetables, and it was the majority view not to include vegetables at this point.

Seconded by Councillor Braithwaite, That staff be directed to bring forward for consideration by Council bylaw amendments to implement a new boulevard encroachment process as outlined in correspondence item no. 2010-54.

The Director of Engineering Services advised that through a staff assessment of the crosswalk located at the intersection of Eastdowne Road and Haultain Street, a low pedestrian count was observed, and therefore it was determined that pedestrian activated lights would not be warranted at this location.

However, recognizing the unique street environment, Mr. Marshall suggested adding "zebra" crosswalk markings to replace the existing parallel lines to increase the visibility of the crosswalk.

At the suggestion from a member of the Committee, Mr. Marshall said he would look into erecting crosswalk signs as well.

The Director of Engineering Services said that at the February 1, 2010 meeting of Committee of the Whole attention was drawn to concerns that had been expressed regarding the lack of adequate line-of-site for vehicles travelling east on Beach Drive in the vicinity of 495 Beach Drive, due to on-street parking. Further consideration was deferred pending additional information from the Engineering Department after consultation with the residents in the area.

Referring to his memorandum containing the results of the consultation, Mr. Marshall said that he suggests that parking be eliminated at the most critical section of the road, shown as Phase 1

in the diagram attached to correspondence item no. 2010-56, which would remove approximately 4-5 parking spaces. Mr. Marshall also suggested that the area be monitored over the next six months, with a view to implementing additional restrictions later should they be warranted.
