ArtsAlive is Oak Bay Parks, Recreation and Culture's annual public sculpture program where pieces are selected to be shown outdoors in our municipality for approximately one year. Ten installations were selected by the Public Art Advisory Committee for 2019/20, with artists selected through a public call.

Each artist was sponsored by a local business or community group. During the year, the community votes for their favourite piece, and the most popular work is considered for possible purchase by the municipality. The remaining sculptures are for sale to private residences, or can be donated to Oak Bay for a tax receipt. The current sculptures will be in place until April 2020.
